FINANCIAL STABILITY REPORT

Clark County is the largest county in Nevada with 2,205,207 residents, 75 percent of the state's population.

The median household income in Clark County is \$51,575, which is \$2,314 less than the US median income, which was \$53,889 in 2015.

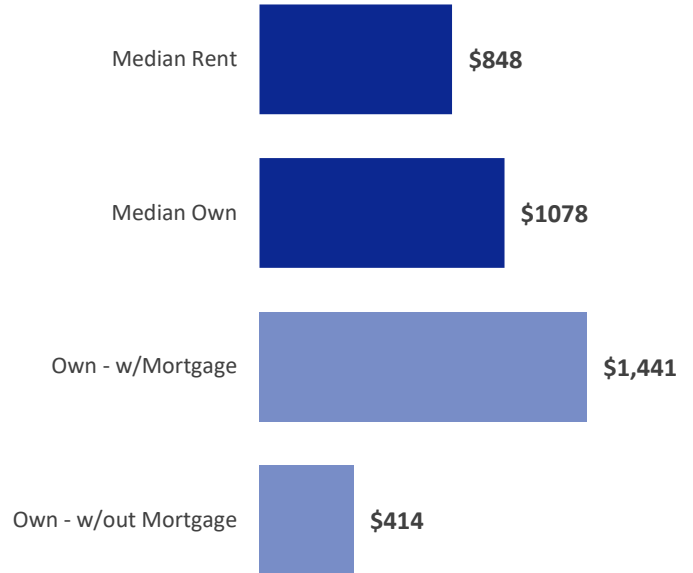
On average, it costs more per month to own than to rent a housing unit in Clark County.

A larger proportion of the working-age population (16 and over) is in Clark County's labor force (65.2 percent) than the United States as a whole (63.7 percent).

Approximately 55 percent of the workforce in Clark County between the ages of 16 to 64 has fulltime, year-round employment.

In Clark County, approximately 15.7 percent of the population is living in poverty, while 21.6 percent can be classified as low-income, falling between 100 percent and 200 percent of the poverty line.

In Clark County, homeowners with a mortgage have the highest monthly housing costs.
